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■(June-Sept)

The total number of new reports for this period was 1337. This is up 4.6% from a similar period last year. Overall pending was down7% from prior year to date and down 15.7% from last report. Our workers' compensation incoming was down 6.8% and non-workers' compensation was down 7.4% during a similar reporting period from PYTD. There are only three (3) Hurricane Sandy cases pending.

■CLAIMS PERSONNEL

The Assistant Claim Manager is out on FMLA since August 10, 2015. A Supervisor and Claim Representative position in our workers' compensation unit are our current vacancies. All other promoted personnel are currently in place.

The preceding results reflect audits completed on 12 individuals. Individual results were 97%, 95%, 87%, 91% 90%, 98%, 89%, 91%, 95%, 97%, 90%, and 97%.

■FRAUDULENT CHECK

The fraud check was done for July and August. There were no internal or external problems. We have completed an additional 25 checks in accordance with our direction from the Executive Director.

■ACCOUNT VISITATIONS AND INSTALLATIONS.

Connie Rogers completed a workers' compensation installation for new workers' compensation accounts Fairfield and Scotch Plains Board of Educations on September 2, 2015. Ellen Shaw completed a workers' compensation installation for Westfield Board of Education on September 3, 2015 and also hosted a PCIT claim review with the business administrator and broker on their pending workers' compensation claims.

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■EDUCATION AND TRAINING

Ron Huntley attended the Advanced Casualty Claims seminar hosted by Munich Re. Mr. Huntley found the seminar to be educational and informative.

■MISCELLANOUS

Since June, we have been preparing for the transition of the handling of the errors and omissions new and existing claims with Summit Claims Services and Rich Pevner, Vice President. Communication about the change has been disseminated to our districts, brokers, and vendors on multiple occasions. Policy information, deductibles, and our recommendations have been sent and discussed with Mr. Pevner. The transition had some hiccups but for the most part, there have been few issues. At present we are trying to get claim reports from Summit. These claim reports are required by our Loss Control Department, Underwriting Department and for our brokers. Mr. Pevner and I met with our seven defense counsels in late June. This was done to get him acquainted with the attorneys handling the errors and omissions pending and to assure him they were capable of continuing to handle these files.

The Claim Staff was provided photos of our future office building and were allowed to visit our new location. Their feedback was favorable.

Dave Sacks, Freeman, Barton, participated in a settlement day with workers' compensation representatives on September 1, 2015. Claims and other managers participated in the workers' compensation Navigator presentation on July 22, 2015. Mr. Giannetto participated in the Marsh Clear Sight Customer Advisory Council and Exchange on July 21, 2015. Claims conducted their monthly meeting with Qual-Lynx on June 23, 2015. The following topics were discussed: New Districts, Bayonne Managed Care, FROIs, Duplicate Repricing and a change in personnel.
